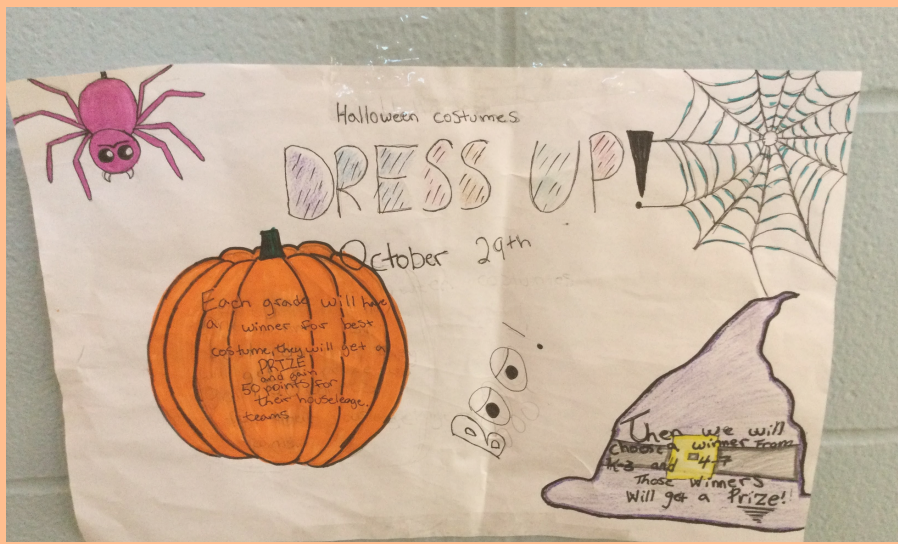
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ARTICLE

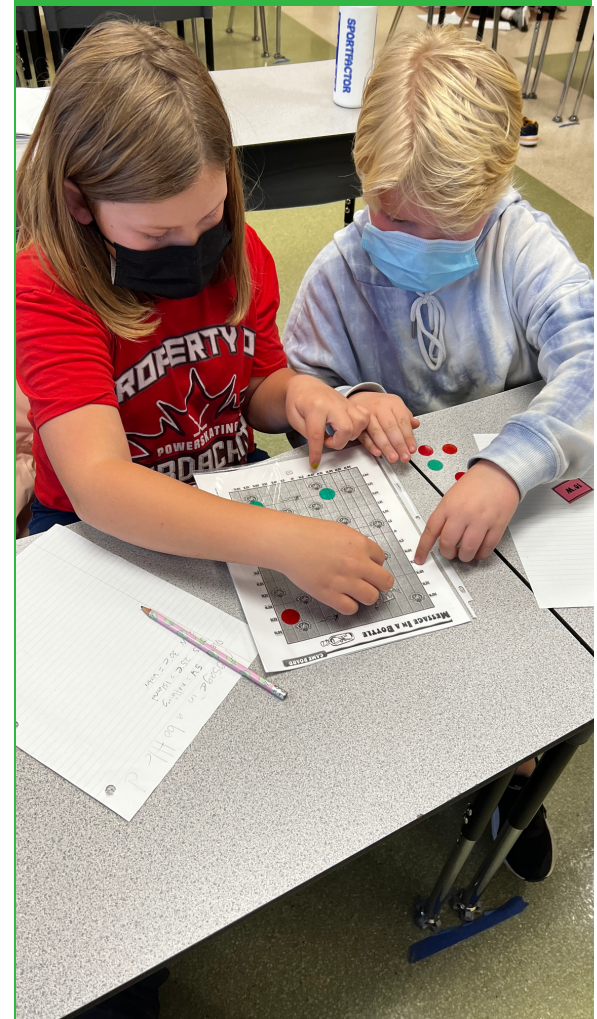
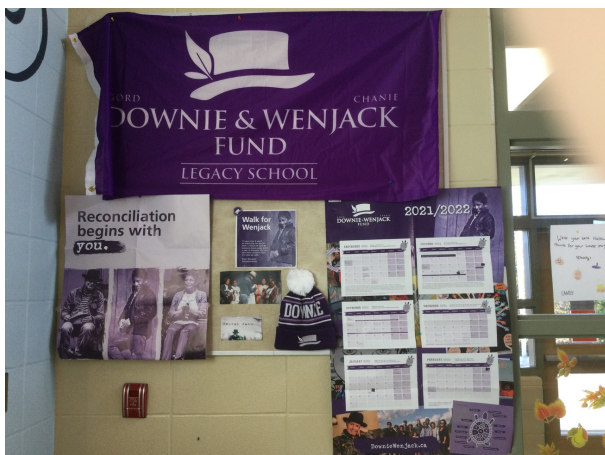

The Gord Downie and Chanie Wenjack Foundation has been challenging the people of Canada to “Do Something”.

October 21st, 2021 was an amazing day where the Grade 7 student’s “did something”. At 9:00 am, the entire grade 7 class left the school and walked 7 Km to Salter’s Lake and back to school. Our goal was to raise awareness and to experience a part of Chanie’s walk. Our amazing students and their families also donated \$132.60. 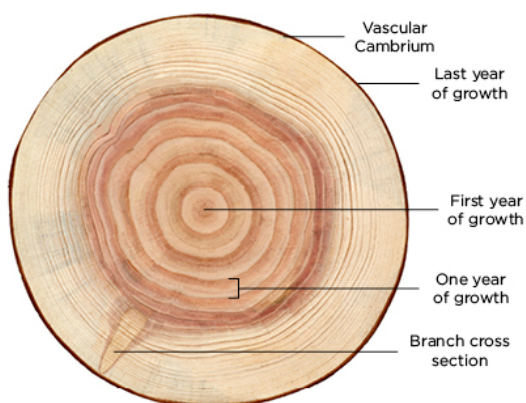
Trees can talk?!

Trees communicate. Their roots are connected through an underground network of fungi, nicknamed the “Wood Wide Web,” that allows them to share resources with each other. They “talk” by transmitting nutrients to one another through the fungi. For instance, a mother tree, or oldest and strongest tree in the forest, will share some of her sugars with smaller, nearby trees.

- express ideas, emotions and understanding through movement, music, dramatic play or visual representation



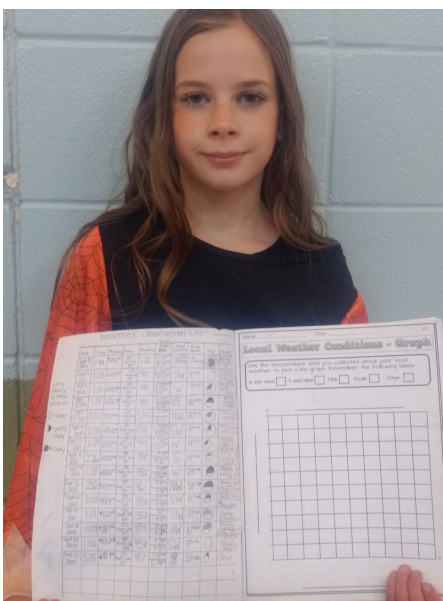
In **Mathematics**, students:

- record daily weather

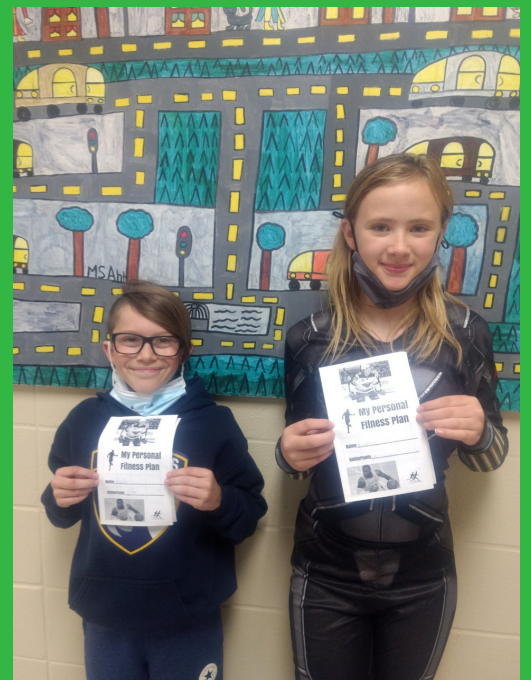
In **Social Studies**, students:
